Common Botany Walk 6th August 2009

20 people joined the botany walk led by Dr Alan Showler which meet at the Village Hall at 7pm to learn more about the botanical life on the Common.

We started by looking for small butterflies in the tree canopy but it was a little late in the day and we did not see any. We next saw 2 different types of bind weed (as if 1 is not enough). By the time we reached Daisy Pond we had seen many examples of trees which had red berries. At Daisy Pond Alan told us how the rare Starfruit was found, what conditions were needed for it to survive, and what was need to be done to the pond to bring it back to life. We followed unfamiliar paths back seeing many examples of wildlife including fungi.

We ended up at Pickup's Pond (on the edge of the Common), see picture below, where we were told about the affect of introducing foreign species into the wild, (someone had put goldfish into this pond). Introduced specied like the goldfish eat newt spawn and dragonfly lava thus reducing the biodiversity of the pond and upsetting the balance of nature.
