#### Felling on the Common

The third phase of felling was due to start in October 2021. FONC was especially concerned that this should not damage the archaeological site (interpreted as a Romano-British farmstead)

#### Any other business

**Pollards**: Trevor Hussey raised concerns about the condition of the veteran pollarded trees and the danger of them falling down. Expert advice will be sought.

Wooden posts near Blacksmiths, Downley: FONC was waiting for the West Wycombe Estate to erect replacement posts.

**Footpath along Ladies Mile:** this was very muddy because of the wet weather and heavy use, thanks to more people exercising during COVID lockdowns, It was pointed out that, despite its heavy use, this was not a legally recognised footpath. Mitigation measures could include widening the path again using the brush-cutter and spreading woodchip. The Estate could be asked if they had spare woodchip to donate. Any scrub clearance should respect the necessity of cover for nesting birds.
